Food Dudes are Back!

The Food Dudes Programme began in the school this week. Food Dudes is Ireland's national healthy eating programme for primary schools. It

works by positively changing children's attitudes towards eating fresh fruit and vegetables. This is achieved by combining three key elements - repeated tasting, rewards, and role modelling - on a recurring 3-year cycle.

The programme has changed slightly from previous years. This year, for Junior Infants to 1st Classes the programme consists of portions of fresh fruit and being provided over an vegetables intervention period of 16 consecutive school days (Phase 1). 2nd to 6th Classes will also be tasting fruit and vegetables but as they have already been introduced to Food Dudes they will be tasting for 5 days.
